

Pull Tab Window Card Ideas



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This tutorial contains all the measurements and instructions that you need to recreate these cards along with a complete list of supplies.

Card #1 – Landscape Style Card



Creating the Pull Tab Card

1. Cut a 3-1/8 x 3-5/8 inch piece of black cardstock.
2. Cut a 3 x 3-1/2 inch piece of the blue patterned paper.
3. Cut out the black pull tab from a piece of patterned paper using the Keeping Tabs punch.
4. Adhere the pull tab to the top of the blue patterned paper and then adhere the blue patterned paper to the black cardstock piece from Step#1.

Creating the Window Section

5. Cut 5-1/4 x 4 inch piece of thick basic white cardstock.
6. Cut the window into the right side of the white cardstock using the 2-3/4" square die from the Stylish Shapes die set.
7. Emboss the white cardstock, from Step#6, using the Exposed Brick 3D embossing folder.

Creating the Slider Section

8. Lay the white embossed cardstock face down. Lay the pull tab card face down on top of the white cardstock so it is positioned over the window. The top of the pull tab card should be flush with the top of the white cardstock.

Add a foam dimensional strip on the white cardstock to the left, right and bottom of the pull tab card. You are basically using the foam strips to create a “pocket” for the pull tab card so that it easily slides in and out of the card.

Be sure to watch the video for some tips on placement.

Assembling the Card

9. Cut a 5-1/2 x 4-1/4 inch piece of black cardstock.
10. Cut a 5 x 3-3/4 inch piece of the floral patterned paper, stamp a greeting on it and adhere it to the center of the black cardstock.
11. Add additional dimensionals to the white embossed cardstock piece and adhere to the black cardstock so the patterned paper (from Step# 10) shows through the window.
12. Slide the pull tab card into place from the top of the card.



- Stamp the large floral image on a scrap piece of white cardstock using Early Espresso ink. Color in the image using stampin' blends or your favorite coloring tools. Cut out the image with the coordinating die, trim the bottom stem down with a scissors and adhere to the left side of the card front as shown.
- Stamp a greeting on the pull tab card.

Card #2 – Portrait Style Card



Creating the Pull Tab Card

- Cut a 3-1/8 x 3-5/8 inch piece of black cardstock.
- Cut a 3 x 3-1/2 inch piece of the blue patterned paper.
- Cut out the black pull tab from a piece of patterned paper using the Keeping Tabs punch.
- Adhere the pull tab to the top of the blue patterned paper and then adhere the blue patterned paper to the black cardstock piece from Step#1.

Creating the Window Section

- Cut 5-1/4 x 4 inch piece of thick basic white cardstock.
- Cut the window into the top of the white cardstock using the 2-3/4" square die from the Stylish Shapes die set.
- Emboss the white cardstock, from Step#6, using the Exposed Brick 3D embossing folder.

Creating the Slider Section

8. Lay the white embossed cardstock face down. Lay the pull tab card face down on top of the white cardstock so it is positioned over the window. The top of the pull tab card should be flush with the top of the white cardstock.

Add a foam dimensional strip on the white cardstock to the left, right and bottom of the pull tab card. You are basically using the foam strips to create a "pocket" for the pull tab card so that it easily slides in and out of the card.

Be sure to watch the video for some tips on placement.

Assembling the Card

- Cut a 5-1/2 x 4-1/4 inch piece of black cardstock.



10. Cut a 3-3/4 x 5 inch piece of the black flower patterned paper and adhere it to the center of the black cardstock.
11. Add additional dimensionals to the white embossed cardstock piece and adhere to the black cardstock. The black flower patterned paper (from Step# 10) will show through the window.
12. Stamp a greeting on the bottom left side of the blue pull tab card. Then slide the pull tab card into place from the top of the card.
13. Cut a 3/4 x 4 inch piece of the black flower paper and adhere it to the bottom of the embossed white cardstock.
14. Stamp the large floral image on a scrap piece of white cardstock using Early Espresso ink. Color in the image using stampin' blends or your favorite coloring tools. Cut out the image with the coordinating die, trim the bottom down with a scissors and adhere to the left side of the card front as shown.
