

Diagonal Stack Cut and Shuffle Design



This tutorial contains all the measurements and instructions that you need to recreate these cards along with a complete list of supplies. 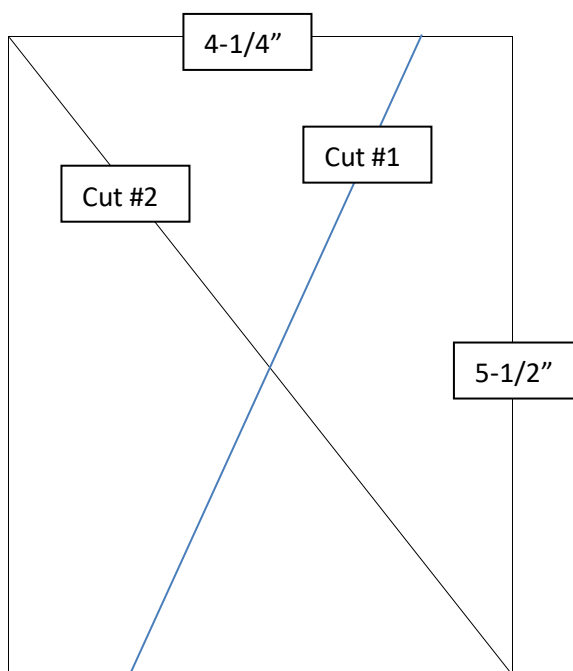

Cut two pieces of patterned paper at 4-1/4 x 5-1/2." Stack them together (with the two different patterns facing up) and make two diagonal cuts through both pieces at the same time. Make cut#1 first. Then turn the papers and make cut#2 from corner to corner.





Shuffle the cut pieces around to create 4 separate diagonal designs. Each diagonal design will have two different patterned paper pieces.

Adhere two patterned paper pieces to each of the 4 different card bases to create the diagonal design.

Notice how two of the diagonal designs come out of the upper right corner while the other two diagonal designs come out of the lower left corner of the card front.

Now you are ready to create the focal point and decorate the cards.

The cards can be used in portrait or landscape style if you are using a non-directional patterned paper.

Basic Card Design



1. Start with a 5-1/2 x 8-1/2 inch piece of Basic Beige cardstock. Score the 8-1/2 inch side at 4-1/4 inches to create the base of the card.

2. Complete the stack, cut and shuffle process as previously described.

3. Adhere two patterned paper pieces to the card front to create the diagonal design.

4. Cut about a 2" square shape from a piece of white cardstock using the Stylish Shapes Dies. Stamp a greeting on it using Early Espresso ink and adhere to the center of the card front.

5. Stamp the flower image on a scrap piece of white cardstock using Early Espresso ink. Add Petal Pink ink to

the flower with a sponge dauber. Add Mossy Meadow ink to the leaves with a sponge dauber. Cut out the image with the coordinating die.

6. Add a bit of linen thread behind the floral image before adhering to the card front. (I recommend watching the video for some tips on this).

7. Embellish with a few Charming Shimmer Faceted Dots.
